

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING October 16, 2025

The regular meeting of the Salem Church Council was held at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 16, 2025, in the Board Room. Members present were Susan Jensen, Judi Knipmeyer, Bill Oelrichs, Stanton Thompson, Carleen Buchanan, Corey Robinette, and Janice Johnson. Vice-President Bill Oelrichs called the regular meeting to order. The minutes were read and approved. The financial report was presented, discussed, and approved. The balances as of September 30, 2025 were \$77,021 in the General Fund and \$7500 in the Building & Grounds Fund. The total average attendance was 107 during September; this includes 16 in-person (8 a.m. Service), 64 in-person (10 a.m. Service), and 27 live-stream views.

Correspondence: None Committee Reports:

- Christian Ed/Stanton: Children's Sunday will be October 19; the theme will be "Uniquely You." June has been working on a variety of artwork with the children that will be displayed in the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. The offering collected will help with updating the nursery.
- Building & Grounds/Bill: The electrical inspection was completed by Shippy Electric. He noted that as he was scanning the roof for lightning rods, he saw some shingles were missing. The church roof was installed in August of 2016 by CCR Roofing. Bill will contact them.
- Cemetery Committee/Bill: No report
- Memorial/Susan: No report

- Stewardship/Judi: Judi will meet with Sarah early next week to review and revise our upcoming stewardship mailing.
- Evangelism/Carleen: On November 8, from 10:00-2:00, committee members and confirmands will once again have a table at Moose's where they will collect money to purchase turkeys for Thanksgiving distribution through the Food Pantry.
- Worship/Janice: The committee met and approved the 5th Sunday pot -luck suggested as an alternative to recent 5th Sunday services.
- Ushers/Carleen and Janice: Council members will continue ushering.
- Financial Stability Committee/Judi Knipmeyer, Janice Johnson, Delbert Goetz: No report Unfinished Business:

Corey Robinette updated the

Council regarding the Search Com-

mittee's progress. There is still one reference outstanding that is keeping our profile from being posted.

- The Budget Committee met prior to the Council meeting, and Susan Jensen presented the proposed budget. After discussion, the draft budget was approved for presentation to the congregation at the budget meeting on November 23, following the 10:00 worship.
- Staff interviews will be scheduled in early 2026.
- Questions about whether our church is currently an "Open and Affirming" church have come to the office staff; we are not currently ONA. The Council was provided information about the process to become ONA, but it was determined we would need to wait until we have a called pastor before broaching this further.
- Discussion was held about safety and security during church services. It was decided no changes would be made at this time.

 A list of things that need attention in the church, cleaning and re-
- in the church, cleaning and repairs, was presented to the Council for planning purposes. These and additional items will be prioritized and addressed in the coming months.
- Council discussed an expressed concern about the time it takes for Council minutes to appear in the Lamplighter. Since the minutes are approved at the following Council meeting, there is no clear way to change that timeline. Tabled for further discussion.
- Two new computers were recently purchased, a desktop for Sarah's office and a laptop for June, both with Windows 11 software. Cost was \$2240 which will come from the General Fund.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES/SPECIAL MEETING

November 2, 2025

On Friday, October 31, 2025, president Delbert Goetz received a phone call from a church member inquiring about the possibility of offering the Vandiver family use of the parsonage following their recent, devastating fire. President Goetz contacted Council members via text message to inform them and also to start the conversation regarding this possibility. After a lengthy exchange, it was determined the Council members were generally in favor of the suggestion but needed to have a face-to-face meeting to discuss it more completely, formalize a lease agreement, and vote in person.

On Sunday, November 2, 2025, following the worship service, Janice Johnson, Susan Jensen, Judi Knipmeyer, Delbert Goetz, Bill Oelrichs, Carleen Buchanan, and Stanton Thompson met. Susan Jensen had prepared a draft lease for the group to peruse. In reviewing the draft, the following points ultimately were decided prior to the vote:

- •Lease and rental amount acknowledge this is temporary housing following a disaster.
- •Rent will be \$500 / month to be paid on the first day of each calendar month.
- •The lease will be for one year unless:
- o Salem calls a permanent pastor who wishes to live in the parsonage
- o Tenants find permanent housing. Tenants should notify the Council president of their intent to vacate
- o at least 30 days before the next rent is due.
- •At then end of one year, if the Vandiver family wants to remain in the parsonage, a new rental rate will be negotiated
- •Tenants will retain / maintain renter's insurance on the property
- •Utilities will remain in the church's name. Tenants will pay Salem UCC for the cost of those utilities by the 5th of each month.
- •Tenants have sole responsibility for access and cost of phone and internet.
- If repairs of plumbing, electrical, heating or air conditioning systems or appliances are required, tenants should contact the church secretary who will contact the Building and Grounds Council representative. Unauthorized repairs will be the tenant's financial responsibility.

Other points regarding the rental:

- •All rental income will be deposited into the Building Fund
- Utility income will be deposited into and bills paid out of the General Fund

Bill Oelrich moved and Stanton Thompson seconded the motion to approve the lease and offer tenancy to the Vandiver family. Passed unanimously.

Judi Knipmeyer shared that a church member had volunteered to fund professional cleaning of the parsonage prior to the Vandiver's move. She will contact that person so that may proceed. She also shared that after November 9th, the remaining library books will be donated to Lafayette County Enterprises so they may recycle them.

With no further business, the meeting was closed.
