#### CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING November 20, 2025

The regular meeting of the Salem Church Council was held at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 20, 2025, in the Board Room. Members present were Delbert Goetz, Susan Jensen, Judi Knipmeyer, Bill Oelrichs, Carleen Buchanan, Corey Robinette, and Janice Johnson.

President Delbert Goetz called the regular meeting to order. The minutes were read and approved. The financial report was presented, discussed, and approved. The balances as of October 31, 2025 were \$72,773 in the General Fund and \$8894 in the Building & Grounds Fund. The total average attendance was 106 during October; this includes 13 in-person (8 a.m. Service), 67 in-person (10 a.m. Service), and 26 live-stream views.

- Building & Grounds/Bill: One of the toilets in the women's restroom by the office was leaking; thank you to Gash Plumbing who handled the repair at no cost.

- Stewardship/Judi: The budget ballot and Time and Talent sheets will be mailed to all active members on Monday, November 24. The return date for both is Sunday, December 14.
- Evangelism/Carleen: The committee received \$1300 in donations for Thanksgiving turkeys

- Unfinished Business:
- Search Committee update: Salem's profile is active. Corey is in contact with Damien Lake, Associate Conference Minister, and the entire committee will be meeting with him virtually in the next few weeks to continue the search process.
- Books from the Board Room were donated to Lafayette County Enterprises to be recycled. Thank you to Bill Oelrichs and Carleen Buchanan for painting the Board Room. The carpeting will be cleaned on Monday, November 24th, and the Council will then assess its condition for further consideration. Carleen is checking on the cost of cabinetry.
- Annual staff interviews will be held on January 22nd, starting at 5:30 p.m.
- The Great Salem Food Fight has been highly successful. Over \$3000 in groceries have been donated. Plans are to move the food to the basement on November 29. [Note: After the meeting, Delbert and June arranged for the wrestling team members to move the food following their practice on November 24. In just 15 minutes, they moved all the food. A huge thanks for the kids' and coaches' efforts.]

#### **New Business:**

- December's Council meeting will be on December 16th instead of the 18th.
- Fall Congregational meeting will be held Sunday, December 23rd, following the 10:00 service. Main business is to introduce the

proposed 2026 budget.

- The Advent Chorale will be December 7th at 4:00 p.m. Council members will usher.
- A \$166 credit was received from Church Mutual following the Workman's Comp audit. The credit was applied to the property insurance quarterly payment in November.
- In February, there will be a clean out of items in the church that are no longer useful to our ministries. An article in the January Lamplighter will provide further details.
- Sarah provided information to the Council regarding scheduled withdrawals from the Stu Starke fund that were provided in the 2025 budget. Susan will work with Sarah and Edward Jones to get the current issues corrected.
- Council discussed, voted, and approved that the parsonage rental payment will start December 1, and the Vandiver family will pay half of the November utilities.

Next Council meeting: December 16, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the "Lord's Prayer."

#### The Foundation of Our Faith
