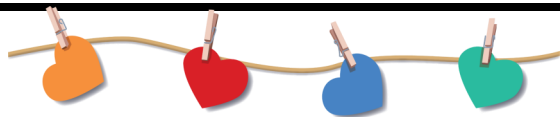


Help Show Our Old Doors the Exit

If you have tried to enter or exit the Main Street doors of the education wing in the past year, you may have found them very difficult to open or close. Sadly, after 50+ years of use, they are old and are wicking moisture whenever it rains or is overly humid. At times, they simply can't be opened. While they are designed to be self-closing and locking, since they don't close well, they have been found unlatched at times when they should not have been. Consequently, during the week, they are not opened or used right now.

After contacting multiple companies in Kansas City, the Council has received bids to replace the doors with ones that are nearly identical, maintaining the beauty and integrity of our church frontage. To do so will cost between \$12,000 - \$15,000, depending if they can reuse all or part of the hardware.

The Council would very much like to do this through donations. If you would be willing to assist, please drop your gift by the church office or place it in the offering plate with a notation that it is to go to the education door replacement. Thank you in advance for your support of our church and our facilities.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

March 17, 2026

The regular meeting of the Salem Church Council was held at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 17, 2026, in the Board Room. Members present were Delbert Goetz, Susan Jensen, Carleen Buchanan, Janice Johnson, Stanton Thompson, Judi Knipmeyer, Bill Oelrichs, and Corey Robiette. Newly elected Council members, Courtney Gash and Peter Thaler, also were in attendance.

President Delbert Goetz called the regular meeting to order. The minutes were read and approved. The financial report was presented, discussed, and approved. The balances as of February 28, 2026 were \$111,306 in the General Fund and \$6648 in the Building & Grounds Fund. The total average attendance was 116 during February; this includes 9 in-person (8 a.m. Service), 70 in-person (10 a.m. Service), and 37 live-stream views.

Correspondence: A thank you note from the Conference for Salem's contribution of \$3665 for OCWM was shared.

Committee Reports:

- **Christian Ed/Stanton:** April will be a busy month with Easter (Sunrise Service), Testimony Sunday, and Confirmation.
- **Building & Grounds/Bill:** Memorials from the Hubert Dickmeier family have been designated for painting around the outside windows.
- **Cemetery Committee/Bill:** If weather is suitable, the second Saturday in May will be the cemetery clean-up day.
- **Memorial/Susan:** No report

- **Stewardship/Judi:** No report
- **Evangelism/Carleen:** The last Souper Supper will be held Monday, March 23rd at Salem.

Worship/Janice: No report

• **Ushers/Carleen and Janice:** Council members will continue ushering.

• **Financial Stability Committee/Judi Knipmeyer, Janice Johnson, Delbert Goetz:** No report

Unfinished Business:

- Search Committee update: The Council and Search Committee will be following up with a potential candidate in early April.
- Cabinetry has been installed in the Board Room. An additional wall cabinet also will be purchased, and some finish work will be done to complete the room. Many thanks to all the Council members and their families who assisted in the upgrade to the room.
- Council members have cleared the storage area across from the church offices, and filing cabinets have been acquired for future storage of important paperwork. Unused items have been tagged and are available for purchase; anything not taken will be donated at the end of March.
- Janice Johnson prepared a listing of the rental prices for various locations around the community. Council will review those and consider revision of the prices we currently charge for use of our spaces.

New Business:

- BJ Salyer and Tina Gibler reviewed the church's 2025 financials and provided a document to indicate they were in order. Approved by Council.

• Council approved a continuance of an annual service agreement with Alumbaugh Heating and Cooling.

• The revised Music Director and Christian Education Coordinator job descriptions were approved.

• It was discussed and decided the offering plates will be passed for the 10:00 service on Easter Sunday.

• The Maundy Thursday Service of Light will be a combined service with Salem, Central Christian, and First Presbyterian. It will be held at 7:00 p.m. in Salem's Fellowship Hall.

• Ballots for the Board of Elders, Board of Christian Education, and Church Council were counted. 88 votes - 87 yes, 1 no.

• Baccalaureate will be held at Salem on Sunday, May 3, at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. The Elders will serve as ushers.

• Testimony Sunday, April 12. Confirmation, April 19.

Next Council meeting: April 21, 2026, at 7:30 p.m. in the Board Room

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the "Lord's Prayer."

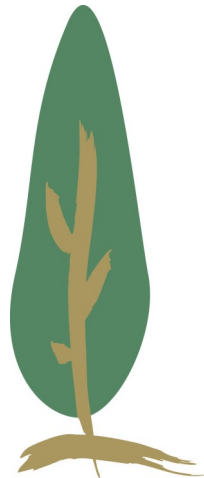

Christian symbol

CEDAR TREE — A species of evergreen used to decorate for Christmas, the tall cedar tree symbolizes Christ's majesty year-round. Cedars of Lebanon, which have grown to 130 feet, were known to Old Testament people. "The trees of the LORD are well watered, the cedars of Lebanon that he planted" (Psalm 104:16, NIV). David's palace and both Solomon's palace and temple were built of cedar wood. The word cedar is found 75 times in the Bible. Due to its evergreen nature and longevity, this tree is associated with eternal life and thus sometimes used in cemetery landscaping.

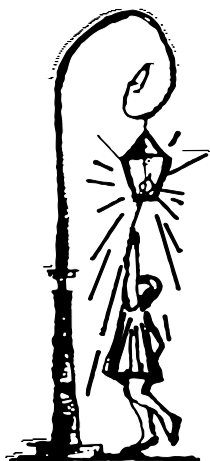
